Words from the Pastor

here was one particular moment when my wife and I decided to



use online giving. It was a Sunday like any other. Pastor Chris and I were leading worship. The sermon was complete, hymns had been sung, and the Offering was being collected.

But the Ushers simply would not come forward with the Offering. Our excellent colleague, Organist Eleanor Hinzmann had to keep playing and playing; she used all the notes.

The reason for the delay—our own loving child.

For a long time our children had been sitting up with us by the Pastor's chairs. At least, that is, until they learned to love tying my cincture ropes to my chair. It only took a couple of times of chairs clunking behind me as I stood for us to decide to have the boys sit with family friends and their kids.

And there Andrew sat—Offering envelope in hand. We thought having our loving child carry that envelope and place it in the offering would be a good way to teach about commitment. Until that Sunday, when my wife's child thought that keeping the envelope meant he could keep the offering that was inside.

The Ushers took special delight in understanding what was going on, and standing by that creative child until he finally put the envelope in the plate.

We signed up for "Simply Giving" the next dav.

ur Savior's has long used a version of Simply Giving—a way for folks to sign up to have bank to bank transfers as their way of sharing in the Offering. It's a slick system administered by a company endorsed by the ELCA called "**Tithely.com**".

About a dozen households within Our Savior's already use "Tithely". It called for them to go to the website, go through some registration steps, and let the system know the amount(s) they'd like to contribute, the date for a single gift or the regular day(s) of the month they'd like to contribute. The control is all in the giver's hands.

The Office receives emails each time a contribution is given, and those gifts are recorded in our records to the household who gave.

But this month we are embracing something new—the technology to donate to our Offering not with check or cash, but via Text from our cell phone or tablet.

Lots of Churches are already doing this. My son's congregation pretty much only uses this format—with folks pulling out their phones during the Offering in order to give. (Yes—the same young Andrew of Offering Envelope Hoarding fame)

Our Council has discussed giving this system a try. In an age where few people carry cash and many young people have never written a check, this may be a good resource. Who knows, maybe Andrew will hear about it and contribute, too.

A New Way of Giving for Churches

Generosity overflows each week as our Offering Plates are passed. We hear Christ's Gospel, we hear the invitation to continue the work God has begun, and checks and cash and Offering Envelopes are collected. Together, they make possible the support of our building, our staff, our ministry efforts in Great Falls, and the ministry we share with the broader Church. Together, those financial resources make it possible to do things none of us could do just on our own. Generosity overflows at *Our Sav*iors.

But more and more, fewer and fewer people carry checks with them to service. Even carrying cash is more and more replaced with the handy Debit Card.

What is a member or visitor to do if they wish to participate in the Offering but don't have check or cash???

Your Council is beginning an experiment to answer that question. This May we are going to begin offering a way for folks to participate in the Offering by just using their phone. Like many Churches around us, *Our Saviors* is going to try Offering by Text.

The process is meant to be simple. Text the number (844) 806-7501 in your phone, type "Give", and you'll be led to a place on the web where one can securely donate to *Our Savior's*. The first time you try this, you'll be prompted to designate a Card or a Bank Account you'd like to use. Then, you can designate the amount of the donation, whether you want this to be a one time gift or a recurring donation, and the amount. An email is sent to the Church Office, allowing the Offering to be recorded and credited to a household just as if it had come in an Offering Envelope.

This process is not meant to replace using Offering Envelopes or dropping a check or cash in a plate. It is meant to offer convenience to those whose life habits are moving beyond carrying checks or cash.

We've just subscribed to this service, through **Tithe.ly**, the online bank transfer giving tool the ELCA has been using for years. It takes about three weeks for this whole process to be set up and secured by regulators. But by the third week of May, it should be up and running. My Grandfather would never have imagined this as an option, but let's hope it will be a handy new tool.
