
### Palm Sunday—April 13th

## Maundy Thursday


April 17th, 7:00 p.m.

# Words from the Pastor

This month I share some thoughts about one of the most moving Worship
Services of the year, as well as a word about our Special Congregational Meeting set for April 27th.



hile Easter is always special, the Sunday prior is especially poignant. Known as Palm Sunday, it begins with the celebration of Jesus entering Jerusalem on that special day. Worship will begin with a special reading, palm fronds will be waved, and our Choir will process into service as just a sample of what happened that day Jesus finally arrived in Jerusalem as the Lamb of God.

But during the service we will experience something I look forward to year after year. Following the opening liturgy and the initial lessons, we'll turn to a reading of the whole Gospel story of Jesus from his hosting of the Last Supper, through His time in the Garden of Gethsemane, his trial, and ultimately his crucifixion and burial.

The Lectionary offers this reading to us as a threshold through which to enter the whole drama of Holy Week. It foreshadows what we'll remember on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and it sets the stage for what we'll hear on Easter morning.

But what is especially rich about the service will be that all of us as a congregation will take part in it's presentation. Pulling the words straight from the Bible, we'll be reading that story as a Readers' Theater. A narrator will move us through the story—but along the way persons from within the congregation will stand and read the roles of the characters in the lesson. Peter will rise and speak. Pontius Pilate will stand and speak. The High Priest and the Servant Girl will rise. And along the way, all of us as the congregation will respond as the Disciples or the Crowd.

This Readers' Theater always seems to start off a little slow, feel a little wooden. But it doesn't take long before the drama builds, and having the people sitting next to us becoming the people of the story becomes compelling. And nothing pulls us into the story like speaking together as the crowd, "Crucify him"......

I'm really looking forward to sharing this Readers' Theater from the Gospel of Luke with everyone. It is the perfect way to gird a heart for Holy Week.

he second through for this month is a word about our upcoming Special Congregational Meeting. At our Annual Meeting this January, I wrote and spoke about the challenge we are facing as we strive to square the chasm between your generous giving and our relentless Budget Deficit. My thoughts included my conclusion that the only remaining route to bridge that gap would be to reduce our Staff Expenses—specifically, moving my role as Pastor from Full Time to Eighty Percent Time.

The push for this move continues to come from our month to month to month deficit. In spite of an increase in overall giving during 2024 of over twenty percent over 2023, we still face a roughly two thousand dollar deficit each month. And while our financial reserves have absorbed this assault, those reserves are not infinite.

And so, on April 27th we'll gather after service to discuss and see if we are at a place of consensus regarding next steps. In essence, the proposal is to transition my role and compensation from Full Time to Eighty Percent— with trims to base salary and compensation moving us pretty close to covering that budget shortfall.

In practice, this transition would see me in a regular schedule of Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday—dropping the Thursday I normally staff. I'd still be available every day via phone, and would shift days in the Office to cover urgent needs or events like weddings or funerals.

While these thoughts were introduced at our Annual Meeting on January 26th, we need to have time as a Church Family to listen to each other and consider options.

So plan on being part of Worship this month—for Palm Sunday to be part of the story of Christ's Passion, for Easter to celebrate the beginning of Christ making all things new, and on the 27th as we consider how we can be stewards of our shared ministry in this season of Our Savior's journey.

# Lenten Renewal Continues this Month!

This year our Lenten journey will be rich in Renewal and Fellowship as we share midweek services with folks from *First Presbyterian Church*. Our plan is for each congregation to host three Midweek services — the first three at Our Savior's, the concluding three at First Presbyterian. Holy Week Services will be in our own locations.

A Lenten Soup Supper will also be shared—humble in menu, rich in fellowship!



While no Supper will be offered on March 5th (*Ash Wednesday*), Our Savior's will host suppers on March 12th and March 19th. First Presbyterian will host the remaining three meals on March 26th, April 2nd, and April 9th.

Both meals and worship will occur in the hosting congregation's Fellowship Hall. Like the early Church, we will eat and then worship at table.

Our worship will be grounded in a Lenten Midweek Liturgy by Marty Haugen titled "Holden Evening Prayer". Stepping away from the Lectionary, the weekly homilies will follow themes drawn from Dr. Martin Luther's portion of the Small Catechism on The Lord's Prayer. Written as a resource for families to listen to their heritage and talk about their faith around their kitchen table, Luther offers not only the petitions of the Prayer, but reflections on what Jesus' words mean as they leap from page to our heart.

- March 12th—The Introduction and First Petition.
  - What does it mean that God invites us to call on God with the trust of a child to a parent?
- March 19th—God's Kingdom Come, God's will be done.
  - Where should we expect to see signs of God's heart—in our world and in our lives?
- March 26th—Daily Bread
  - Remembering that God provides to all, what should be our heart's response?
- April 2nd—Forgive us
  - Jesus frames this prayer not only between us and God, but us and our neighbor.
- April 9th—Save us
  - Is this not what "Jesus" means—God Saves? Where will God reach us?
